LEARNING AT HOME

LITERACY

Literacy learning includes a range of skills, including listening, speaking, reading, writing and spelling. It enables children to express their thoughts, ideas and emotions.

You can help your child by:

- Asking open-ended questions that start with 'how' or 'why'.
- Talking with your child on a range of topics, including thoughts, opinions and emotions.
- Sharing stories with them and encouraging them to retell stories they have heard.
- Using a range of words in your discussions and discussing the meaning of words.
- Reading stories with rhyme and rhythm.
- Exposing your child to poetry and song lyrics well after they are able to read for themselves.
- Listening to audiobooks and podcasts.
- Engaging your child in real world opportunities to use language, such as ordering food at a restaurant or writing lists, labels, emails and letters.

NUMERACY

Numeracy learning enables students to understand how numbers work in every day situations, the many ways we measure and compare items, or make calculations essential for everyday life.

You can help your child by:

- Counting objects by touching each as you go, and matching the total to the corresponding number.
- Read counting stories, sing counting songs and rhymes with younger children.
- Ask older children to help you work out everyday problems; 'there are 6 muffins in a pack, how many packets do we need to buy for you and your siblings to have one each day for lunch?'
- Compare collections to decide which has more, less or the same.
- Play board games and strategy games to develop thinking skills.
- Use a calendar and an analog clock.
- Have your child help read timetables for transport when travelling, or calculate arrival times when driving places.
- Resist the temptation to express a dissatisfaction your own perceived lack of ability with math! Most people are better than they think, it's the lack of confidence that holds them back!

Our school community is made up of staff, families and students who each impact Kambalda Primary School. In promoting student voice, we select student councillors each year to lead our school. 
