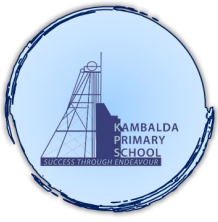

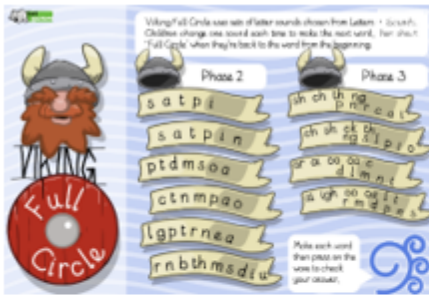

SCHOOL PRIORITIES:

Looking for ways to support your child's spelling? Try these free online games from ICT Games.



Viking Full Circle requires students to substitute sounds and their spelling patterns in one word to make a new word, in a way that leads them back to the original word. Choose a group of spelling patterns relevant to their ability. Access using the QR Code to the right.



Spooky Spellings focuses on the spelling of high frequency words. Students drag the correct letter hats to make the word that has been shown to them. Feedback is given to indicate whether they have spelled the word correctly, reducing the likelihood they will practice incorrectly.
